CLINICAL AESTHETICS: HA DERMAL FILLERS



An introductory course for injection of hyaluronic acid (HA) dermal fillers

This course offers a thorough review of anatomy and physiology, treatment indications and contraindications, and guidelines for safe, evidence-based practices. Participants will complete an asynchronous online lecture session and attend an in-person hands-on training at Boston College's Chestnut Hill campus. The online lecture session features injection demonstration videos. Hands on training provides small group instruction and injection practice under the direct supervision of experienced clinical aesthetic practitioners.

This course includes:

- A review of all FDA approved brands
- Discussion and demonstration of safe dosing and injection techniques for desired outcomes
- Mentorship for client management with practice on live models
