CLINICAL AESTHETICS: NEUROTOXINS



An introductory course for clinical aesthetics injection of neurotoxins in the upper face

This course offers a thorough review of anatomy and physiology, treatment indications and contraindications, and guidelines for safe, evidence-based practices. Participants will complete an asynchronous online lecture session and attend an in-person hands-on training at Boston College's Chestnut Hill campus. The online lecture session features injection demonstration. Hands-on training provides small group instruction and injection practice under the direct supervision of experienced clinical aesthetic practitioners.

This course includes:

- A review of all FDA approved brands
- Discussion and demonstration of safe dosing and injection techniques for treatment of the upper face
- Mentorship for client management with practice on live models

- Relevant facial anatomical structures
- Appropriate screening and client selection criteria
